Called Meeting of Session

The Called Session meeting, at which a quorum was present, was held at the church on December 28, 2019 after the morning worship service. Present were moderator, the Rev. Christine Bohn, Elders Beth Morrell, Sandra Carter, Doug Roberts, Marilyn Brumley, Paul Burkey, John Morrell and Charles Brumley. Elders absent were April Morenco and Will Exum.

The Moderator opened the meeting with prayer.

The purpose of the called meeting was to discuss the proposed repair to the organ.

Larry Sprinkle has been tuning the organ twice a year for many years. He is noticing air leakage from some notes causing inability to tune those individual notes. He has recommended that the repair work be done by Randall Dyer. Mr. Dyer built the case work for the organ in the 1980's. Mr. Dyer inspected the organ and proposed repairs shown in the attachment.

Paul motioned and Beth seconded that we proceed with repairs as proposed by Mr. Dyer. The motion was approved. Charles motioned and John seconded that the money for the repairs come from the General Fund supplemented by requested donations. The motion was approved.

No further business, the meeting was adjourned with prayer.

Mr. Brumley -

Thank you for the conversation earlier this after noon.

Pursuant to that discussion, as well as historical context from Larry Sprinkle, we propose to do the following:

1. Remove all the pipes that need to be removed to access the toe boards on the organ's windchest.
2. Carefully and cleanly saw the support member under the keyboards that is restricting removal of the said toeboards.
3. Remove the toeboards for transport to our shop for further work.
4. After removing the present slider seals, which have proven problematic, sand and/or dress the bottoms of the toeboards down to bare wood.
5. Glue a piece of 1/2" maple die board on the bottom side of each toe board.
6. Spot and drill a counter-sunken hole under each pipe toe hole.
7. Provide and install new spring-loaded telescoping slider seals, one for each note.
8. Return the toeboards to the church.
9. Reinstall them in the organ.
10. Re-pipe the organ.
11. Tune the pipes.
12. Put the casework back together.

As we discussed, our rate is \$55/man hr. While we generally charge more for off-site work, you are close enough that that won't be necessary. Likewise, we can include the mileage at no additional cost.

I'm not sure when Easter is this year, and I know we can't begin the work until after we install the current project, which is nearly ready to ship in the shop now, but we will do our best to coordinate the dates. The hitch will be ordering the slider-seals themselves.

Please review this, feel free to ask questions, and let me know that its OK to proceed.
