Scripture reading: Revelation 12-13 (selected verses)

Then a great sign appeared in heaven: a woman clothed with the sun, with the moon under her feet and a crown of twelve stars on her head. She was pregnant, and she cried out because she was in labor, in pain from giving birth. Then another sign appeared in heaven: it was a great fiery red dragon. [It] stood in front of the woman...so that when she gave birth, he might devour her child. She gave birth to a son...Her child was snatched up to God and his throne. Then the woman fled into the desert, where God has prepared a place for her.

Then I saw another beast coming up from the earth. It had two horns like a lamb, but it was speaking like a dragon. It deceives those who live on earth by the signs that it was allowed to do in the presence of the beast. It forces everyone—the small and great, the rich and poor, the free and slaves—to have a mark put on their right hand or on their forehead. It will not allow anyone to make a purchase or sell anything unless the person has the mark with the beast's name or the number of its name. This calls for wisdom. Let the one who understands calculate

the beast's number, for it's a human being's number. Its number is six hundred sixty-six.

Then I looked, and there was the Lamb, standing on Mount Zion. I heard a sound from heaven that was like the sound of rushing water and loud thunder. The sound I heard was like that of harpists playing their harps. They sing a new song in front of the throne, the four living creatures, and the elders.

They sing the song of Moses, God's servant, and the song of the Lamb, saying, "Great and awe-inspiring are your works, Lord God Almighty. Just and true are your ways, king of the nations. Who won't fear you, Lord, and glorify your name? You alone are holy. All nations will come and fall down in worship before you, for your acts of justice have been revealed."
